The 3 most common etiologies of acute scrotal pain in the pediatric age group are epididymitis, torsion of the appendix testis, and testicular torsion.

Management. All patients with confirmed testicular cancer he should be discussed in a specialist MDT. The main treatment options for testicular cancer are surgery, radiotherapy, and chemotherapy; the treatment of choice depends on the tumour type, risk scoring, and prognosis. Most cases suitable for surgery will undergo an inguinal radical orchiectomy. This removes the testes along with the spermatic cord, allowing for maximal lymphatic system to be removed.
